Chapter 1: The DNA of Greatness

Where Purpose is Unknown, Abuse is Inevitable

Your identity crisis didn't start with you. It began in Eden.

Genesis 1:26 reveals humanity's original design: "Let Us make man in Our image, according to Our likeness; let them have dominion." But before Adam and Eve could fully understand what bearing God's image meant, the enemy launched his first assault—not against their behavior, but against their identity.

"Has God indeed said...?" wasn't just questioning a command about fruit. It was attacking their understanding of who they were in relation to their Creator.

The same battle that began in Eden continues today. The enemy's strategy hasn't changed—only his packaging. Where he once whispered doubt about God's word, now he systematically undermines human identity through education, entertainment, and technology.

The voices you allow to speak into your life will ultimately shape your identity. I learned this the hard way.

I came from an abusive childhood where my identity was shaped early by my father's voice. This sent me on a destructive path because, without knowing it, my identity in my Heavenly Father was being shaped by my relationship with my earthly father. My perspective of myself became my reality. It was a lie, but I didn't know that.

The Second Most Powerful Force on Earth

The Holy Spirit is the most powerful force on earth. The second is a man or woman who knows who they are in God.

It's very difficult to understand the greatness of God if you can't see any in yourself. You'll identify God by your perspective of yourself. The way you see yourself affects how you see your entire world—and everyone in it.

Once you understand who you are in God, problems, heartbreak, and tragedy cannot define you. Nothing can stop a life of greatness when you know who you are. Conversely, nothing can derail a life of greatness like a person who has no idea who they are.

This is why the enemy works so hard to distort human identity. It's because he can't stand looking at God's reflection. Every human face is a divine mirror that reminds him of the Creator he betrayed. His rage isn't just against humans—it's against the image we carry.

The Power of Voices

Creative power is in the tongue. Everything we see came from spoken word. God created everything by His voice.

Like it or not, you usually become who the voices of influence said you would be. When someone we love and trust crushes us, we crumble. When they speak life to us, we flourish.

Your voice is the most powerful of all voices in your life. What you say about yourself matters more than what anyone else says about you.

The voices from my childhood never really go away. But thankfully, those destructive words have been replaced by positive and godly ones. The same can happen for you.

The breakthrough generation must understand: we're living in a time when voices seeking to shape identity have multiplied exponentially. Social media algorithms. Educational curricula. Entertainment programming. Each one is designed to impact the next generation's understanding of who they are.

The battle for identity isn't just personal—it's generational. What we allow to speak into our children's lives will determine whether they carry forward the image of God or surrender to corrupted alternatives.

Chapter 2: Start Wars - The Battle for Your Beginning

False Starts and True Identity

I call this chapter "Start Wars" because the war for our souls is strongest at the beginning. Philippians 1:6 says, "being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus."

God will complete what He initiates, not necessarily what we started. We often expect God to bless what we've begun, but His promise is to finish only what He has started in our lives.

This is crucial to understand. The way you see yourself at the start of the race affects how you see yourself during the tough parts. Many races are won and lost at the starting line.

The enemy understands this principle better than most believers. That's why his most vicious attacks often come during new beginnings—new marriages, new ministries, new seasons of breakthrough. He knows that if he can corrupt your understanding at the start, he can influence the entire journey.

The Double Barrel Moment

When I was around ten years old, during another fight between my parents, my mother told us we were leaving for good. My father disappeared and returned with a double-barrel 12-gauge shotgun.

I knew the shotgun. I had seen it before. He was screaming and cursing. Then suddenly, he yelled at me to look at him. I was terrified, not knowing what was about to happen.

He made me watch him load it. He then turned the gun around and pointed the barrels toward his face. He grabbed my hand and forced my fingers on the triggers.

Then he said words that haunted me for years: "Son, kill me. Pull the trigger. Blow my brains out. Because if you let your mother leave, that's what I'm going to do to myself. So you might as well be a man and kill me now. Because it's the same. It will be your fault either way."

This was my introduction to a controlling spirit that gets its strength from making the person being controlled think it's actually their fault. It was identity warfare designed to corrupt my understanding of what family should be.

But here's what I understand now that I couldn't see then: this traumatic moment was the enemy's strategy to plant destructive patterns that would repeat across generations. If he could convince me that love requires manipulation, that family means control, that authority operates through fear—then I would probably pass those same toxic patterns to my own children.

The enemy wasn't just attacking me. He was attacking my seed.

Breaking Generational Patterns

The breakthrough generation faces a unique challenge: we must break cycles that have been operating in our lineage while simultaneously establishing new patterns for those who come after us.

This requires recognizing that our personal healing isn't just about us. Every lie we believe, every wound we leave unhealed, every distorted pattern we accept becomes spiritual DNA that we pass to the next generation.

When I chose to forgive my father, I wasn't just releasing bitterness for my own benefit. I was breaking a cycle of anger and control that had operated in my family line.

The Blame Game

When Adam and Eve fell, God asked Adam what happened. Adam replied, "The woman whom You gave to be with me, she gave me of the tree, and I ate." Eve said, "The serpent deceived me, and I ate."

This was the launch of the Start Wars. If you want to walk in the greatness God placed within you, it's time to stop blaming everyone for your issues. Most of what you're going through right now wasn't caused by the devil. Much of it results from your decisions, actions, and words.

Taking responsibility for your part is the first step toward breakthrough.

But responsibility doesn't mean condemnation. The breakthrough generation understands the difference between acknowledging our choices and accepting shame for circumstances beyond our control.

Chapter 3: Lessons from the Redwood King

Positioned for Greatness

David understood something crucial about greatness—it's not a solo journey. Even though he was anointed king while still a shepherd, he never stopped honoring King Saul. His loyalty extended to Saul's entire family.

David's approach to greatness challenges everything our culture teaches about success. In a world that celebrates self-promotion, individual achievement, and personal branding, David demonstrated connected greatness—influence that flows through relationship rather than despite it

Rooted and Connected

The Redwood Forest teaches us profound lessons about the Kingdom of God. These magnificent trees can stand over 300 feet tall, yet their roots are only 6-10 feet deep. The secret to their staying power? Their roots stretch outward hundreds of feet and intertwine with other Redwood trees' roots. They actually "fuse" together, building one giant root system the size of the whole forest.

One tree can't come down because all the other trees are holding it up!

David was a Redwood. He refused to allow himself to "grow higher" without connecting and honoring those in the forest with him. He understood that when a person messes up, it doesn't disqualify them for future service. David believed in the power of restoration.

This principle is vital for the breakthrough generation. You cannot achieve your full potential in isolation. God designed greatness to be relational greatness.

Consider how this applies to our current cultural moment. Social media creates the illusion of connection while actually isolating people from the deep relationships necessary for sustainable success. Platforms promise influence without requiring the character development that comes through authentic community.

The Mephibosheth Principle

David's treatment of Mephibosheth reveals something profound about kingdom greatness. When David was about to sit on the King's throne, he asked, "Is there still anyone who is left of the house of Saul, that I may show him kindness for Jonathan's sake?" (2 Samuel 9:1).

Mephibosheth was the grandson of David's former enemy, the son of his beloved friend Jonathan. He was crippled in both feet, living in exile, expecting judgment rather than mercy.

But David didn't just restore Mephibosheth's inheritance—he brought him to eat at the king's table permanently. David treated the son of his enemy better than most people treat their friends.

This is the heart of the breakthrough generation: we see potential where others see problems, we extend mercy where others expect judgment, and we restore what others would discard.

Honor Has Its Rewards

It's impossible to live a life of greatness without understanding honor. When you respect others, most of the time, they will respect you in return. Greatness and honor are inseparable.

David showed reverence to Saul when he didn't have to. He could have killed Saul, but he didn't. David respected Saul, but he honored God more. He knew the law of sowing and reaping.

Throughout my life, I've had to show respect to people I didn't want to esteem. Some didn't "deserve" my regard. But God said to "honor your father and mother." I honored my father by going to his funeral, even after all he had done.

Honor isn't about the person deserving it. Honor is about you understanding kingdom principles.

Chapter 4: The Power of Perspective

Learning to Live a "Big Picture Life"

One of the most important moments of my life happened on my lawnmower. I was whining and complaining to God about a family situation when I heard His voice say, "Son, you've got to start looking at your world with the Big Picture. Do you really think this situation is going to look like this just five years from now?"

He began to show me a vision of a long, winding train. He revealed how He could see from the engine all the way to the caboose, even when I could not. His perspective was completely clear. He had already seen the conclusion. I was challenged to view things "now" as they will be "then." This was only possible by choosing to embrace "The Big Picture."

That lawn mower revelation transformed how I approach every challenge. Instead of reacting to immediate circumstances, I learned to respond from an eternal perspective. Instead of being overwhelmed by temporary pressure, I began to recognize divine purpose in the process.

"I Am the Alpha and the Omega"

We've heard that scripture most of our lives, but it's time to fully understand what it means. God can see the engine and the caboose of your life. He has seen the beginning and end of any test or trial you've faced.

God has nothing to obstruct His view. His perspective is always clear. While we wait, He's allowing things to pass by us that weren't meant for us. While we are frustrated by the train lights for making us late, He could be protecting us from something on the other side.

This heavenly perspective is crucial for the breakthrough generation because we're experiencing the alignment of all biblical patterns at once. What past generations witnessed over centuries, we're seeing unfold in decades.

He Sees Greatness in You

The Big Picture simply means that God saw greatness in you before you were ever formed in your mother's womb. God is Big Picture. He doesn't create a person to be small and insignificant. He has called you to greatness.

I would have never dreamed the boy who was dropped and broken by two separate fathers would travel the world and tell the Good News of God's plan. I never imagined writing books and telling my story, but it's happening.

Greatness isn't defined as earthly success, fame, or fortune. It's simply when you've made an impact on your world for Christ and leave a legacy of greatness behind when you're gone.

The breakthrough generation must understand that our greatness is measured not by platform size but by Kingdom impact. Not by social media metrics but by spiritual multiplication. Not by what we accomplish for ourselves but by what we establish for future generations.

Chapter 5: Positioned for the Flood

Build during the shaking while others panic. Preserve life when destruction comes. Carry the seed of the future kingdom. Walk in covenant relationship with God.

You're not here by accident. God has been preparing you through every trial, every disappointment, every "false start" to be ready for this moment.

Jesus didn't casually mention Noah when describing end-time conditions. His statement established prophetic pattern recognition as essential for discerning our present moment.

Even though I'm not there with you, I see it. I know it's there. God put it there.

Find people who are already walking in the anointing you desire. Hang around them, listen to them, take notes, and emulate the things you admire.

Don't Live in the Past, But Don't Forget It

You can't do anything about your past. What's been done is done. We must move on. We must forgive. We'll never forget, but we've got to forgive.

The reason you have a "testimony" is because you've been through a "test." If I could go back in time, I wouldn't change anything. The love, grace, mercy, and forgiveness I extend to others have been molded in the pain of my past.

Be Open to Loving Criticism

One of the hardest things for a leader to do is accept constructive criticism. Greatness isn't tied to you always being right. Greatness is tied to you doing the right thing!

Remember, it's all about perspective. Your mentor or friend may be sitting at the same crossing, but they may be a little higher than you.

Never Stop Learning

If you're teachable, you're reachable! Never stop learning and growing. Your age or formal education level has nothing to do with your ability to educate yourself and grow.

Vision is like climbing a giant bookshelf to reach your destiny. Each higher step comes from each book you read, each season of learning. Throughout your life, you'll climb the bookshelf of knowledge until you can reach out and grab your destiny.

Chapter 9: I See Greatness in You

Five Words That Changed Everything

Standing in that courthouse, ashamed and broken after being arrested for a STUPID crime, I felt like the biggest failure in the world. My fiancée, Sandy, was there, and I expected her to walk away like everyone else had.

Instead, she looked at me with tears in her eyes and said five words that would change the trajectory of my entire life:

"I see greatness in you."

Those five words didn't just encourage me—they literally saved my life. In that moment, someone finally saw in me what God had always seen. Sandy didn't see my failures; she saw my potential. She didn't see my past; she saw my future.

What made those words so powerful wasn't just what she said, but when she said them. In my darkest moment, when everything external screamed "failure," her words carried prophetic authority that revealed divine perspective.
